Religious & Spiritual Life Resources for Staff & Students - Rev. Todd Boling

- Rev. Boling shared ways that Religious and Spiritual Life support students at TCU and you, as employees, can also get plugged into and be a part of as well.
- Their office exists to support all students, not just those who are religious, as they define spirituality as that which gives your life, purpose, and meaning, so regardless of what your religious or spiritual perspective might be, their office is here to support you and care for you.
- Pastoral and Spiritual Care
  - One of the things they do is support students and even employees at times. They can't support employees with the magnitude they do with the students because they don't have enough time and resources, and they want to focus on the student body. He stressed that everyone has a bad day and if they need a safe place to unload they are there, to join you on your journey in a safe and confidential space. Since they are ordained, they are not mandatory reporters and we are safe to share with them as they are legally protected as well.
- Spiritual Support Groups
  - Bringing students together with like-minded students at the beginning of each semester and pivoting with specific needs
- Student Religious Organizations
  - We currently have 20 religious organizations here at TCU, representing the Christian, Muslim, Jewish, and Hindu traditions.
  - If you know of a student who is struggling to find a place to connect, send them to their office
- University Workshop Services
  - They offer 4 University led workshop services throughout the year, planned and led by their office
    - Frogs First worship specifically designed for first year students
    - Blessing of the animal service, usually the end of September or the beginning of October
    - Carol's by Candlelight happens in December
    - Ash Wednesday



- Connected Spirit Programming happens every Monday through Friday, from noon to 1:00, offering students a way to connect.
  - Monday's meet for lunch in Market Square
  - Tuesday's meet at the Founder statue for tacos and learn about religious communities
  - Wednesday's burritos and belonging where students can explore what it means to be in a community with people and feel a sense of belonging
  - Thursday's contemplative hour, also for employees, open the chapel, spiritual exercise journals; meditative music; self-directed; quiet hour; come and go
  - Friday's lunch and learn, where they bring area churches into their office to help students connect with an area church.
- Interfaith Engagement
  - Teach people how to live in a community with people who might believe something different from them.
- Grief & Loss
  - Office takes a lead, every time we lose a student; if it's a current student they offer a vigil in their honor and their memory bringing the community together so they can process this grief and loss
- Sacred Spaces
  - Robert Carr Chapel open most of the time to use the space as you need to
  - Multi-faith Prayer and Meditation Room first floor of Jarvis Hall, open anytime Jarvis is open
